

Ukraine on the Brain: The Media's Impeachment Obsession

Day after day, the Democrat media (largely redundant, we know) parrot the latest tactics in the Left's campaign to remove President Trump from office by any means necessary. For two years, it was Russia, Russia, Russia. Now, it's Ukraine, Ukraine, Ukraine.

A revealing study by the Media Research Center found that in just 10 days (September 20 through September 30), the broadcast networks carried more than seven hours of coverage devoted to a Deep State source's complaint about President Donald Trump's phone call with Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky and the ensuing calls for impeachment.

Meanwhile, only 46 minutes of it referenced Democratic frontrunner Joe Biden's son Hunter Biden's sweetheart deal with a Ukrainian company.

This lopsided coverage reflects deep-seated hatred of Donald Trump to the point where the media, especially the networks, have abandoned any pretense of professional fairness.
